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
The notes for this file are typed out in some length so that readers can more or less re-create the full message of the presentation.

Now, I would never say that the gospel ministers and the health care workers I've had the privilege of knowing were completely separated, but neither do I believe we've managed to blend these elements the way God wants us to.

As a result, over the last century we have largely developed along two lines: preaching, and state-of-the-art technical medicine. We've already looked at the Lord's call for an evangelistic focus on simple methods and common ailments as evangelistic tools, but what about our preaching?


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


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In 1893 Dr. Kellogg was on track, and being opposed and "made war upon" (Ellen White's words) because of it. He spoke at the Ministerial Institute that preceded the General Conference session in February of that year.

Now it should be remembered that it was only a couple months before this, November 22, 1892, that Ellen White's comment that the "Loud Cry of the third angel has already begun in the revelation of the righteousness of Christ" had appeared in the *Review*.

It was a pretty exciting time!

But Dr. Kellogg had reservations...

In his talks he pointed out dozens of Bible verses and Spirit of Prophecy quotations that said that God's people needed to be examples of divine love; that they needed to let their light shine in good works of mercy and benevolence to all around them.

He talked about Isaiah 58, which ends with the promises that God's last day people, those who turned their feet from the Sabbath, those who were called the repairers of the breech, the restorers of paths to dwell in, and who would ride on the high places of the earth and be fed with the heritage of Jacob...



Dr. Kellogg—We ought to be able to show that we are doing what the Lord says should be done first.

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

Kellogg was talking about the Haskell Home for Orphan Children. The General Conference had voted in January 1891 to start an orphanage, but a year later they hadn't received enough money from church members to even begin construction,

Then Mrs. Caroline Haskell, a Presbyterian, donated \$30,000 in memory of her Presbyterian husband. By the time Kellogg was talking in February 1893, this little building was nearing completion—paid for entirely by Mrs. Haskell's donation.

You may or may not be familiar with all the history of Robert Wieland and Donald Short...

You may or may not have read 1888 Re-examined...

But let me summarize 60 years of debate that has rattled the Adventist church: The Spirit of Prophecy said that the Loud Cry had begun by late 1892. Now, it is either continuing on somewhat softly, or it has gone away. For years, there have been those who have claimed it was going on nicely, thank you; and those who disagreed.

Among those who believed the Loud Cry had been withdrawn, the big questions have been, "Why?" and "How can we get it back?"

For 60 years we have searched for a theological answer to those questions. The doctrine of righteousness by faith has been tweaked and twisted, re-phrased and maybe even re-invented. But nothing has re-ignited the Loud Cry in any obvious manner. So what's wrong?

Occam's Razor—If you have multiple possible answers to a problem, the simplest one is probably the right one.

I will speak only for myself here—

I think Kellogg was right. And I think the only way that the Loud Cry will be re-ignited is when God's people take up the work of helping other people, even if it be to the total neglect of themselves.

That sounds crazy, doesn't it? But how much of a retirement fund did Jesus have? For that matter, what did He do for a house?

I am NOT saying that everyone needs to go out right now and "sell all that you have and give alms to the poor," but that day is getting very close, and some people will be called upon before others.

What Needs to Be


