
ONE THING JESUS CAN'T GIVE YOU



Matthew 13:28–30

He said to them, 'An enemy has done this.' The servants said to him, 'Do you want us then to go and gather them up?' But he said, 'No, lest while you gather up the tares you also uproot the wheat with them. Let both grow together until the harvest, and **at the time of harvest I will say to the reapers**, "First gather together the tares and bind them in bundles to burn them, but gather the wheat into my barn."

Matthew 13:39–43

The enemy who sowed them is the devil, the harvest is the end of the age, and **the reapers are the angels**... **The Son of Man will send out His angels**, and they will gather out of His kingdom all things that offend, and those who practice lawlessness, and will cast them into the furnace of fire. There will be wailing and gnashing of teeth. Then the righteous will shine forth as the sun in the kingdom of their Father.

When Christ returns there will be a clear **DISTINCTION** between the righteous wheat and the wicked tares.



Matthew 7:21–23

"Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven. Many will say to Me in that day, 'Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name?' And then I will declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness!'



1 John 3:4, 5

Whoever commits sin also commits lawlessness, and **sin is lawlessness**. And you know that He was manifested to take away our sins, and in Him there is no sin.



Some will fully expect to go with Christ when He returns but will not be accepted because they "practice lawlessness"— sin.





Blessed are **those who do His commandments**, that they may have the right to the tree of life, and may enter through the gates into the city.



The Bible makes plain God's expectation of and His provision for our obedience.



1 Peter 2:21, 22

For to this you were called, because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that you should follow His steps: "Who committed no sin, nor was deceit found in His mouth"



Finally then, brethren, we urge and exhort in the Lord Jesus that you should abound more and more, just as you received from us how you ought to walk and to please God; for you know what commandments we gave you through the Lord Jesus. For this is the will of God, your sanctification...



John 5:8, 14

Jesus said to him, "Rise, take up your bed and walk." And immediately the man was made well, took up his bed, and walked... Afterward Jesus found him in the temple, and said to him, "**See, you have been made well. Sin no more**, lest a worse thing come upon you."





John 8:10, 11

When Jesus had raised Himself up and saw no one but the woman, He said to her, "Woman, where are those accusers of yours? Has no one condemned you?" She said, "No one, Lord." **And Jesus said to her, "Neither do I condemn you; go and sin no more."**



Christ offers sinners not only **PARDON** for past sins for **POWER** for future victory.



No temptation has seized you except what is common to man. And **God is faithful**; he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But **when you are tempted**, **he will also provide a way out so that you can stand up under it**.





Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.





Finally, my brethren, **be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might**. Put on the whole armor of God, **that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.**





Now to Him who is able to keep you from stumbling, and to present you faultless before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy, to God our Savior, who alone is wise, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and forever. Amen.

1 John 3:2, 3


