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
#### Bet Sefer


### Bet Talmud



## Illustrations of Platonic Worldviews

Philo - Jew

- Contemporary of Christ
- 1<sup>st</sup> century
- synthesis of Judaism with Greek Philosophy
- God is excluded from world and history
- Eternity there is no past…no future…just present existence…
- Eternity of God has an inability to interact with humanity...
- History is temporal...merely a timeless reduplication of the eternal...

## Illustrations of Platonic Worldviews

Philo - Jew

Exo. 25:8 – What is meaning of God's intention to dwell in the tabernacle? Not literal understanding...Philo says "that God does interact with humanity as dwelling in the sanctuary... God dwells with us...when the soul has a glimpse of the intellectual manifestations..."

## Illustrations of Platonic Worldviews

#### Thomas Aquinas

- God is without space without time
- God doesn't have a body
- He doesn't need a sanctuary
- It is evident that the house of the sanctuary was set up...that God may make Himself known there...The sanctuary is not necessary...and not literal...

## Illustrations of Platonic Worldviews

#### John Calvin

- Text cannot actually mean in "heaven"...
- Time and place are not important on the spiritual level...
- Sanctuary only refers to God's presence of grace...
- Heaven is a metaphor...
- Spiritual level cannot be materialized...
- Time and Space would be a limitation to God


- Rejects Platonic Worldview

# Sanctuary

System of Truth

The subject of the sanctuary was the key which unlocked the mystery of the disappointment of 1844. It opened to view a complete system of truth, connected and harmonious, showing that God's hand had directed the great advent movement and revealing present duty as it brought to light the position and work of His people.
