





- * One of the greatest sessions ever held in our church








Finding the Solution to Our Condition:


Called to Decision:


It Was Recieved in 1893 by the Leaders:


It Was Recieved in 1893 by the Leaders:



Revival that followed...

- 1) Fanatical Criticism against the church.
- 2) Succumbing to worliness in the churches and schools.
- 3) Mistakes of the messengers
- 4) Continued resistance by some to the 1888 message.

Four strategies that Satan brought against the Church following 1893 to divert the revival that made him fear for his life:

2) Succumbing to worliness in the churches and schools.

Satan's Strategy:

"At Battle Creek College, there had been a negative reaction to the revival that had previously taken place. A lack of unity and loyalty among some of the faculty had spread to the students. 'The condition among the students and the college from a religious standpoint was worse than it had ever been.'"

Ellen White Points Out the Problem:

"During 1893, the grace and mercy of God had abundantly bestowed on those in Battle Creek. But while the youth were being moved upon by the Holy Spirit that they might use the rich blessings aright and progress to greater light, nearly all the educators at Battle Creek had lost their clear spiritual discernment, because they did not maintain the victory by determined watchfulness. How easily we can grieve the Holy Spirit, by walking contrary to its enabling, sanctifying influence."

Great Concern:

During the summer of the same year, EGW and others became anxious that the revival and outpouring of the HS would become stagnant, as people fell back into wordiness with a lack of interest for missionary work around the world.

She Then Wrote:

"If men and women have received increased light, what are they doing to warn men and women who do not know that the Lord is coming? Who will leave pleasant homes and dear ties of relationship, and carry the precious light of truth to lands afar off?"

She Then Wrote:

"The worst feature of the iniquity of this day is a form of godliness without the power thereof. Those who profess to have great light are found among the careless and indifferent, and the cause of Christ is wounded in the house of His professed friends."
