
but if we can have but one part done, let it be the individual labor of opening the Scriptures in households, making personal appeals, and talking familiarly with the members of the family,




not about things of little importance, but of the great themes of redemption. Let them see that your heart is burdened for the salvation of souls.






It is a **fatal mistake** to suppose that the work of soulsaving depends alone upon the ministry.




When an effort is made to present our faith to unbelievers, the members of the church too often stand back, as if they were not an interested party, and let all the burden rest upon the minister. For this reason the labor of our most able ministers has been at times productive of little good.



Step 5: Preserve new members through systematic discipleship.




After baptism, new members should be led through a systematic discipleship plan. It is here that the disciple is trained to make other disciples, thus adding to the growth of the church.


Then those who gladly received his word were baptized; and that day about three thousand souls were added to them.

It is little wonder that retention rates of newly baptized church members is so poor. If the excitement of a public campaign fades and the truth has only been accepted in theory but not in practice what else should we expect?



After individuals have been converted to the truth, they need to be looked after. The zeal of many ministers seems to fail as soon as a measure of success attends their efforts.





They do not realize that these newly converted ones need nursing,—watchful attention, help, and encouragement.


Many would be willing to work if they were taught how to begin. They need to be instructed and encouraged. Every church should be a training school for Christian workers.

Let the teachers lead the way in working among the people, and others, uniting with them, will learn from their example. One example is worth more than many precepts.







