

Seasonal Blooms

- In order to have a viable crop you will likely need to purchase corms and bulbs up to a year in advance.
- Seeded crops will need to be started weeks to months in advance of transplant.

Protection Cont'd


- Low Hoops

Flower and Plant Support

 Flower/Plant Support - trellising, netting or twine can be used with small fence posts or wooden stakes







Plant Protection

- Sluggo Plus organic input that prevents damage from cut worms, pill bugs and slugs
- **BT** protects against moth larvae damage

Harvesting

Pick Early in the morning before it gets too hot

Bunch in groups of 10 with Rubber Bands

Put in Hot Water and add a little Bleach

 - Very good selection, easy ordering process.
- Geoseed geoseed.com
 - Huge seed selection, but an older ordering process. You can email your order, but they don't have a website for direct ordering.

• Leo Berbee – berbeeus.com

- Wholesale bulbs, roots and corms BUT you need an account to order)
- Onings America Good prices large quantities
 - Best to go to website and get on the email list. They send out emails detailing when there is inventory available for ordering or sale.



ROOT, SEED AND PLANT SUPPLY COMPANIES

- Wholesale for Small-scale Growers Facebook group run by Jake Bent.
 - The prices are close to wholesale but you can order smaller quantities.
 - Good for trialing new crops you will be paying a premium for shipping.
- Sunflower Selections Good source with Large sunflower variety
- Van Engelen Inc. Wholesale bulbs
- Ball Seed ballseed.com
 - This company has everything, seeds, plugs, bulbs, corms. They have representatives that will work with small farms that are just getting started and a wealth of information on growing.
- Farmer Bailey farmerbailey.com
 - Good source for plugs but has a limited selection available.
